

Building in Training







t was a busy summer for Creston Fire Department volunteers: not only were they responding to numerous flooding and fire calls, but they were also hanging drywall and pounding a new roof onto the new Lake Blaine training center.

"With this department, there are so many people who have so many different skill sets that they can say, 'I have a couple of hours here, and I can do this," said EMT Rachel Siblerud. "It's another team effort, like we do everything else."

The building, an unused modular class-room moved from a site in the Bigfork School District, is not yet ready for use, but Chief Gary Mahugh said the money saved and volunteer effort behind the renovation are making the wait worth it. Most of the project is being handled by volunteer labor, and most of the funding was raised in the last 2 years through the Creston Auction, which is hosted by the Creston Fire Fighters Association.

"We're trying to use as much of the old structure as we can. It's about 3,300 square feet of usable space, ... [and] we're spending about 25% of what the cost of new construction would be for comparable footage," Mahugh said. "We're pretty

close to where we thought we would be for budget, ... but we're still looking for funding and donations toward the completion of this center."

Mahugh said the project is about 70% complete. An existing building on the site has been shifted to make room for the new portable structure, concrete and initial utility work have been completed for both buildings and a new steel roof is in place on the three-classroom portable.

The remaining work involves completion of the exterior, including utilities and skirting, before winter, as well as interior remodeling and painting. But Mahugh said the project is actually larger and should be viewed as a renovation of the entire Lake Blaine complex. It's been about 10 years since major work was done at the site, when a new roof was installed on the station building.

"Part of this whole project will eventually be interior painting and remodeling of the Lake Blaine station," Mahugh said. "This really is a whole upgrade of the Lake Blaine facility."

The new building will primarily be used as indoor training and classroom space for the department's volunteer

firefighters and medical responders. For several years, they have been meeting inside a truck bay at the station before moving outside for practical training.

The classroom and restroom area in the newly installed building are likely to be in use by Nov. 1, Mahugh said. The fitness facility and office workspace are expected to be functional by early 2012. Work on the remainder of the third phase, which includes staff space and on-call bunkrooms, will likely be postponed until after the 2012 auction, when a final fundraising push can be made to complete construction and to furnish and equip the center.

The fire department still plans to hold a community open house when the building is ready for public tours. The date will be posted on the reader board at the Creston fire station and online at the "Creston Auction" page on Facebook.

"On top of training, on top of responding, our volunteer firefighters are also working on this building," said Mahugh. "It's coming together as quickly as volunteers can make it happen."

Getting the Best out of the 2012 Creston Auction

Tips for Sellers

- Advertise your treasures: Contact us in early March to include your larger items for free in our ads throughout northwest Montana.
- List it: For faster service and to insure you are paid in full, bring a list of the items in your load on Consignment Day.
- Consign and donate: Bring all items to the sale grounds Friday, March 30, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Give your best: Donations are welcome and tax deductible. Consider donating one or more items from your load to the Creston Fire Department for the sale.
- Think like a buyer: If you wouldn't spend \$5 on an item, please donate it to the Rummage Sale. All proceeds from items that sell for \$5 or less in the auction are donated to the fire department, so improve the sale by taking these items to the Creston School gym's west door.
- Organize your load: Rather than handing over a box with books, canning jars and videos, make one box for each type of item so that it is easy to sell.
- Form a group: Collect items at your church, school, etc., and bring them as one load to the sale. We'll send the

proceeds (minus the fire department's commission) to your organization.

- Take junk to the dump: We also cannot accept tires, hazardous chemicals, ammunition or livestock.
- Prepare for weather: Bring disposable tarps to cover your items. We regret that we cannot guarantee their return.
- Sleep soundly: We provide security for all consigned items from Friday, March 30, through the sale Sunday, April 1.
- Note this: At Saturday's auction, no items are sold with minimum bids attached. At Sunday's equipment sale, a minimum bid can be set at \$1500 or more. Call 250-7396 for more information on reserves and titles.

Tips for Buyers

- Pack cash: We accept MasterCard and Visa for auction purchases only, so bring cash, checks or your ATM card.
- Buy your ticket: The auction's \$5 bid tickets go on sale at 8 a.m. Saturday. Get \$10 bid tickets for the equipment sale at 9 a.m. Sunday. These fees pay for security.
- Carry ID: Show it to buy a bid ticket.
- Bid away: There is no buyer's premium. Your winning bid is what you pay.
- Stay warm: Hot food is available

throughout Saturday and Sunday.

- Treat your sweet tooth: Visit the Bake Sale in the Creston School gym on Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Even better, donate your favorite goodie! Call 250-7396 for drop-off times.
- Get artsy: The Arts & Crafts Sale is held Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the Eastside Grange Hall.
- **Keep it clean:** Federal rules prohibit smoking on the school grounds. And please leave your dogs at home.

Decision to join: "It's just something I've always loved to do, to just help people out." Highlight: "[I'm impressed with] the professionalism of everything: how seriously we take it, how well we do it and how worried we are about safety. That's something I haven't noticed as much at other fire departments I've seen.... You're not out trying to be a hero; you're just trying to get the job done and let

everyone go home.

Key lesson: "Safety. If you don't have safety, there's no sense in going out on the line."

Goal: To work as a paid fire-fighter and emergency medical technician: "I would like to take my EMT B if I could use it more often."

Reason to join: "The older guys aren't just looking down on the little guys and saying, 'Well, you're new.'... I work the front of the nozzle, pull lines, I've gone inside a couple of times.... They're letting you get your hands in it and teaching you how to do it right."

I had been an EMT First Responder since 1994. I finally was able to get my EMT B license almost 2 years ago.... It was a

huge hourly commitment ... to get that Basic license." Responding: "Depending on the call, you start thinking about things right away: what you're going to do, the circumstances you might come across. Personal safety is No. 1; your crew's safety is a priority. You have to put that all into focus and not get such an adrenaline rush going you forget that stuff. If you don't get there safely, you're not going to do anybody any good." Accident advice: "Every situation's different. You always have spectators, and especially on accidents you have drivers gawking [as they pass the scene].... Try to stay back as best you can and let people do their jobs and do them safely." Reason to join: "We always need new members. It's a big time commitment, but you learn a lot of things and meet a lot of great people. And it's a good thing to do.... If I had it to do over again, I'd do it in a heartbeat."
