9/11 Tribute Draws Community Support

Every Sept. 11, Creston fire fighters remember and pay tribute to their 343 fire fighter brothers who made the ultimate sacrifice in the performance of their duties in New York City on Sept. 11, 2001, and to all fire fighters who have given their life to service in the line of duty. Ferndale and Bigfork fire departments were among the Flathead Valley fire departments that also participated in remembrances at their stations this year.

Each year, in front of the Creston Fire Station, we present the American flag, two engines and at least one department member who stands at attention for a onehour shift from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. This year, 23 members of the Creston Fire Department participated, some doing more than one shift. People driving by showed fantastic support by waving and honking their horns. A lot of them stopped and took pictures, a few would stop and ask why were doing it—but all thanked us. And we thank all of them for their support as we honor our fallen brothers.

CFD: Even Kids Can Stop Fires

Creston fire fighters and emergency responders are visiting the three schools in the Creston Fire District during the week of Oct. 7 with one message: Even kids can play a role in preventing fires.

The visits are timed to fall within National Fire Prevention Week, which commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of Oct. 8–9, 1871, that killed more than 250 people. Creston fire fighters have long used the nationwide tribute as an opportunity to reach out to area students and share basic techniques on how to perform home fire drills, set up a household evacuation plan, check and replace batteries in smoke detectors and more.

The presentations focus on this year's Fire Prevention Week theme, "Have Two Ways Out." said students will be encouraged to discuss the lessons with those at home to ensure everyone knows what to do if a fire breaks out. He also said this week should remind all community members to change batteries in every household smoke detector. Detectors are crucial to saving lives and homes in case of a fire, but they are only reliable if batteries remain fresh. The Creston Fire Department recommends making battery swaps twice yearly when setting clocks back and forward with daylight savings time changes. The department also advises homeowners to upgrade to carbon monoxide alarms in areas of the home or garage where combustion cooking or heating appliances are located.
