I am known to be a reader of sorts, and sometimes from my downtime reading certain phrases grab my attention. When that happens, I have learned that maybe I am being told something and maybe I should pay attention. From that, I have had this nagging thing on my mind: a reference to "a life well lived." This phrase has popped up in my recent reading, maybe some television watching and for sure in my actual life.

Such things make me think about my fire life and what it means to me. And then something happens that solidifies the whole deal. In my case, it was the passing of two close friends in the last couple of months, friends from various parts of my Fire World and both people who make me think of lives well lived. As I often do, I bring my outside realm into my daily Creston Fire life. This darned adage of lives well lived hammers at me, and now I am writing about it.


Why would I choose the topic for this column? It is because of how I feel about fire fighters, especially volunteers and even more so about your Creston Fire Fighters. Much of this comes from my belief that people who volunteer to help others are exceptional folks, and those who decide being a fire fighter and/or medical provider is their opportunity to serve have a special place in my heart. It tells me they are in it for the right reason: to help others who might be having a really rotten day for nothing more than feeling they did something good.

It probably seems like I write about the people of Creston Fire more than I do about engines and rescue rigs and cool medical stuff and even more than that replacement fire station that is garnering much of our time. If you think this, then you are correct. Anyone can have all those big red trucks and interesting pieces of equipment, but not everyone has what we do. We have people who believe in the organizational values of Creston Fire and who know the importance of returning with honor from every run we make.

That takes me back to where I started: a life well lived. When it comes to how someone is remembered after a career ends, and sometimes even life itself, I can't think of a better measure than having others say that person had a life well lived. Even more so, I think the people of Creston Fire are living lives that are well lived. Your Creston Fire Fighters don't serve for recognition or pay, although a thank you from those served does help keep the battery charged. Rather, they are living what I hope is an example of making a difference in others' lives. Being a Creston Volunteer Fire Fighter does not make one special. The special part comes from who these fire fighters are at their core and in their heart.

Some people might say volunteering to be a fire fighter is an outdated model of how things should be done. I would dispute this because I don't view what we do as a job. If it was a job, it would be described as putting out fires and doing CPR and splinting broken bones. No, what we do is serve others to bring comfort and caring during what might be trying times, and in doing that, we use our training to have a positive impact. We do put out fires and a lot of other things, but in the end, it is about the human side of life that matters. It is about the hope that others will be able to say Creston Fire Fighters personify life well lived.

A long-serving member (RIP) once answered a simple question posed by someone around midnight who just had their home saved from fire, "Why did you help us? You don't even know us." That Creston Fire Fighter merely said, "It is what we do." Yup, it is about a life well lived. I can think of no better purpose in life.

Pack cash: We accept MasterCard, Visa and Discover (3% convenience fee) for auction purchases only, so bring cash, check or your ATM card for other purchases.

Head indoors: Take a break from the outside auction Saturday between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. to visit the Rummage Sale in the Creston School gym.

Stay warm: Hot food and drink are available throughout Saturday and Sunday.


